

Lesson 6: Grammar: Objects & Object Form

Rules for Objects & Object Form

- If the noun ends in a consonant:
 - If it ends in a glottal stop (ʔ), then we add *-ti'* [*kwichii'* → *kwichii'ti'*]
 - If it ends in any other consonant then we just add *-i'* [*huunat* → *huunati'*]
 - **Note:** Sometimes if the noun ends in **c**, then in the object form it might change to *-chi'*. [*kihuuc* → *kihuuchi'*]

Verb: hihii (to see)

Singular	Plural
Hihii n - I see	Hihii ch - We see
Hihii m - You see	Hihii mch - You guys see
Hihii - He/She/It sees	Hihii m - They see

Example Sentences

- **I** see the wildcat
 - Hihii**n** tukuti'.
- **We** see the horse.
 - Hihii**ch** wa'urravi'ti'.
- **They** see the gray dog.
 - Hihii**m** kwichii'ti' piver'chka'ti'.
- He sees the red bird.
 - Hihii wichiiti' shurriinka'ti'.
